## South Asia

Pakistan Finance Minister Muhammad Aurangzeb presented his inaugural <u>budget</u> for FY 2024-25 on June 12. It was prepared keeping the IMF bailout package in view, unveiling aggressive taxation measures, including higher taxes on personal incomes and petroleum products, new taxes on real estate, and the withdrawal of several tax exemptions. This includes PkR 1.761 trillion (about USD 6.33 billion at current exchange rates) in <u>new revenue measures</u> which may contribute to an increase in inflation. The government allocated PRs PkR 2.12 trillion (USD 7.63 billion) for the <u>armed forces</u>, marking a substantial increase of 17.6pc over last year.

The Afghan Taliban authorities agreed to attend the third round of <u>United</u> <u>Nations-hosted talks</u> in Doha. This will be the first time the Taliban will attend a gathering of international envoys on Afghanistan since UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres started the process in May 2023, aimed at developing a coherent and unified world approach to engagement with the Taliban.

The vice chairman of the 14th Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference, Bater <u>visited Maldives</u> on June 12-14 and held a meeting with Maldivian officials including President Muizzu. During the meeting with Bater on June 13, Muizzu mentioned the <u>key developmental initiatives</u> such as the China-Maldives Friendship Bridge and said he looked forward to strengthening the friendly relations between the two countries. They also discussed the <u>implementation of the 'consensus'</u> reached by the two heads of state, during the visit of President Muizzu to China.

## Southeast Asia

The United States, Canada, Japan, and the Philippines conducted a <u>two-day</u> joint maritime exercise in the Philippines' Exclusive Economic Zone from June 16- 17, 2024. The exercise was conducted to demonstrate a "commitment to strengthen regional and international cooperation in the maritime domain". It involved four warships and a series of maritime manoeuvres to test and validate the interoperability of the armed forces of the four countries' doctrines, tactics, techniques, and procedures.

Singapore's Prime Minister Lawrence Wong made <u>his first official visit</u>, his first overseas visit, to Malaysia on June 12, 2024. During his visit, he met with the Prime Minister of Malaysia, Anwar Ibrahim, and Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Energy Transition and Water Transformation of Malaysia, Dato' Sri Fadillah Yusof. The two sides discussed progress on projects like the Johor Bahru-Singapore Rapid Transit System Link and the Johor-Singapore Special Economic Zone. The two leaders discussed ways to enhance cooperation in areas of sustainable development, renewable energy, and people-to-people exchanges.

The Chinese Coast Guard (CCG) accused a Philippine supply ship of "deliberately and dangerously" approaching a Chinese ship resulting in a slight collision on June 17, 2024. The CCG further stated that the Philippine supply ship "illegally intruded" into waters near Second Thomas Shoal. Responding to the accusations, the chief of the Philippine armed forces' public affairs office, Xerxes Trinidad stated that "we will not dignify the deceptive and misleading claims of the China Coast Guard". The US State Department condemned the "escalatory and irresponsible" actions by China in the South China Sea and reaffirmed its support for the Philippines.

## East Asia

The Prime Minister of Japan, Fumio Kishida, held a summit meeting with Volodymyr Zelenskyy, President of Ukraine, on the sidelines of the G7 Summit on June 13, 2024. The two leaders signed the "Accord on Support for Ukraine and Cooperation between the Government of Japan and Ukraine" pronouncing Japan's continued support as well as assistance in financial, electricity and mine action sectors to Ukraine. PM Kishida further stated that Japan would aid in the 'recovery and reconstruction of Ukraine'.

Chinese Premier Li Qian made his <u>first official visit to Australia</u> from June 15-18, 2024. He co-hosted the Ninth China-Australia Annual Leaders' Meeting with Australian Prime Minister Anthony Albanese. Premier Li Qian's trip marks the first visit of a senior Chinese official to Australia since 2017. The two leaders signed a <u>range of agreements</u> to foster 'closer cooperation on trade and economic issues, education, climate change and culture'. The two sides announced that they will hold the 10th meeting of the Joint Science and Technology Commission, the Eighth China-Australia High-Level Dialogue, and the Eighth China-Australia Ministerial Dialogue on Climate Change in Australia this year. The two sides confirmed the plan to resume the China-Australia Strategic Economic Dialogue this year and agreed to hold the next round of China-Australia Annual Leaders' Meeting in 2025.

On the sidelines of the G7 Puglia Summit in Italy, Prime Minister of Japan, Fumio Kishida and Prime Minister of India, Narendra Modi held a <u>Japan-India</u> <u>Summit Meeting</u> on June 14. In a readout of the meeting, both ministries stated that the "two leaders noted that the India-Japan Special Strategic and Global Partnership is in its 10<sup>th</sup> year and expressed satisfaction at the progress made in the relationship." They also reaffirmed their collaboration projects, including the landmark Mumbai-Ahmedabad High-Speed Rail project.

## West Asia

On June 12, <u>45 Indian nationals died</u> and <u>more than 50 were injured in a fire</u> at a labour housing facility in Kuwait. Prime Minister Narendra Modi expressed deep <u>sorrow at this unfortunate incident</u> and extended condolences to the families of the deceased. India's Minister of State for External Affairs Kirti Vardhan Singh visited Kuwait to facilitate the early repatriation of the mortal remains of the deceased and ensure the well-being of those injured.

Amidst continuing tensions between Israel and the Lebanese militant group Hezbollah, <u>Hezbollah published a video</u> showing military and civilian locations in Israel and threatened to attack cities, including Haifa. Israel warned Hezbollah of the <u>global consequences of any attack on the ports of Haifa</u> operated by Chinese and Indian companies. He cautioned that if an all-out war breaks out, <u>Israel will strike Lebanon</u> and destroy Hezbollah. Meanwhile, US Envoy Amos Hochstein held talks with Israeli and Lebanese leaders calling for an urgent <u>de-escalation between Hezbollah and Israel</u>.

During a reception marking Eid-al-Adha, Saudi Arabia's Crown Prince and Prime Minister, Mohammed Bin Salman reiterated the importance of ending the conflict in Gaza and called upon the international community to <u>recognise</u> <u>the Palestinian State on pre-1967 borders</u>, with Jerusalem as its capital. On the other hand, Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu protested against the halting of some arms shipments by the US and urged Washington to provide the <u>necessary tools to dismantle Hamas in Gaza</u>. Secretary Blinken clarified that Prime Minister Netanyahu was exaggerating the US's actions, insisting that only one shipment had been halted.

## **Central Asia**

After months of speculation, President of Armenia Nikol Pashinyan declared that <u>Armenia will formally withdraw from its military alliance with Moscow</u>. On June 12, President Pashinyan announced in parliament that "we will leave" the Kremlin's Collective Security Treaty Organisation (CSTO), but "we will decide the timing of our exit". Furthermore, he defended his decision by saying, "it turned out that members of the alliance are not fulfilling their contractual obligations but are planning a war against us with Azerbaijan". Pashinyan's remarks mark the <u>first instance</u> of Armenia verbally expressing its decision to withdraw from the CSTO.

Russian special envoy Zamir Kabulov recently disclosed in an interview on June 11 that while <u>Moscow supports Afghanistan's accession to the Shanghai</u> <u>Cooperation Organization (SCO)</u> under certain conditions, <u>Tajikistan</u> <u>expressed opposition to the Taliban's participation</u> in the organisation. Afghanistan has been an observer member of the SCO since October 2012 being an active participant in the SCO activities, before the collapse of the government in 2021. Zamir Kabulov stated that most participants in the Council of Foreign Ministers of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) member nations <u>supported the resumption of the SCO-Afghanistan Contact</u> <u>Group</u> except for Tajikistan. The Taliban have argued that excluding their representatives from the SCO meetings undermines comprehensive coordination on security challenges, combating drug trafficking, providing humanitarian aid and implementing infrastructure projects.

## Indian Ocean Region

On June 15, <u>INS Sunayna</u>, an offshore patrol vessel based in the Southern Naval Command, entered Port Victoria, Seychelles in the company of Seychelles Coast Guard Ship (SCGS) Zoroaster. INS Sunayna was received by the Seychelles Coast Guard and the Embassy of India. During the visit to Seychelles, INS Sunayna will engage in joint Economic Exclusive Zone (EEZ) surveillance with the Seychelles Coast Guard. Seychelles Coast Guard Ship (SCGS) Zoroaster recently completed her short refit at Garden Reach Shipbuilders & Engineers Ltd (GRSE), India.

Indian Navy and JMSDF conducted the <u>8<sup>th</sup> edition of the bilateral Japan – India</u> <u>Maritime Exercise 2024 (JIMEX 24)</u>. This is the eighth edition of JIMEX, since its inception in 2012. The exercise includes both harbour and sea phases. The IN was represented by INS Shivalik and the JMSDF was represented by the Guided Missile Destroyer JS Yugiri. Integral helicopters from both navies also participated in the joint exercise.

The <u>naval ship 'Surat</u>' is set to join the Indian Navy's arsenal as a major combatant vessel. It commenced its maiden sea trials prior to induction into the Navy's fleet. Surat is the fourth ship of the Project 15B class of guidedmissile destroyers being built for the Indian Navy constructed using cuttingedge technology by Mazagon Dock Shipbuilders Limited
